Using Colons

A colon says to a reader "note what follows." Use a colon before a list of items, especially after expressions such as as follows and the following [items]. Use a colon before a long, formal statement or quotation. Do not use a colon before a list that follows a verb or a preposition.

The duties of this job are as follows: help unload the delivery trucks, sweep the aisles, and stack items on the shelves.

You need to shop for several items: brown shoe laces, a quart of milk, and five or six carrots.
